




Pessimism & Defeatism

- 75% Think life will get worse or stay the same






What Cha Cha proponents want

- Isn't necessarily what the public wants


Presidential to Parliamentary:










Abalos a factor














Important to 44%


Why the 44% are Pro



The 44%: Support Cha-Cha for two reasons. Economic and Political.








Carving up Pros




| 4.4% of the Pro are anti-GMA




Conversion

Reasons the 44% Pro would turn Anti


- 1. Kung mapalitan ang Presidente o magbago ang pamamalakad niya (15.7%)
- 2. Kung ang pulitika ay lalung gugulo (10.9%)
- 3. Kung hindi matitigil ang pangungurakot (8.6%)
- 4. Kung mapababa ang presyo ng mga bilihin (7.6%)
- 5. Kung dadami ang mga trabaho (5.5%)
- 6. Kung hindi magbabago ang pamamalakad ng gobyerno (4.5%)
- 7. Kung lalung tataas ang presyo ng mga bilihin (3.9%)

Political = Conversion

- If Economics accounts for current support-
- Politics would account for shifting.



GMA is the issue

Economic = Reasons for Support

Political (GMA) = Reasons to Withdraw Support

Our Base

- strongly against shift to parliamentary (75%)
- MP's choosing the president (86%)
- not being able to vote for the president (88%)
- change to unicameral (71%)
- Similar patterns of opinion with general population in favor of snap elections (56%) but significantly more doubtful of credibility of plebiscite under Comelec (43%) and acceptability of charter change under GMA (48%)

Important to 40%

What we're after


The fight is not for the solid base of support of GMA (roughly 20% of the country), but for the “soft” majority of the 44% who now support Cha-Cha.
